Responsibilities include:

- Work on designated Orano mining projects as directed, based on operational requirements
- Provide logistical and technical support for exploration/development programs as directed. These duties include, but are not limited to:
 - Collecting and interpreting field data primarily related to the logging of drill core
 - Entering data in project database ensuring accuracy, completeness, and thoroughness
 - Assisting with daily core handling functions (measuring, sampling, photography, moving full core boxes, etc.)
 - Assisting or completing down hole probing data acquisition
 - Providing, as required, written / oral presentation of results: maps, sections, tables, etc.
 - Supervision of geo-technicians
 - May be required to act as the designate for the Project Geologist or Principal Resource Geologist during his/her absence
- Must be fully aware of one's role and responsibilities as defined in the Orano Integrated Management System (IMS), as a Geologist and as a possible Contract Administrator, and enforce them with employees and contractors
