Long Term Strategic Mine Planning

- Lead the development and optimization of Life-of-Mine (LOM) plans, ensuring alignment with corporate objectives, reserve management strategies, and business value maximization.
- Direct strategic mine planning studies, including mine design, production scheduling, scenario evaluation, and economic analysis to support long-term decision-making.
- Collaborate with technical, operational, and financial stakeholders to integrate geological, operational, environmental, and commercial considerations into long-range plans.
- Provide technical leadership and strategic guidance on reserve development, project expansions, and growth opportunities, while mentoring planning teams and driving best practices.

Study/Project Work

- Conduct technical/financial evaluations and trade-off studies on mining projects (opening or expansions of existing mines)
